SMU Dedman School of Law enjoys a successful national and international reputation. The school has ranked among the top five producers of African American law graduates each year, and as the most diverse law school in the country, includes a significant number of Mexican American law graduates.

A variety of national rankings of law schools in the past two years have placed the University of Texas as high as second and not lower than 15th nationally among all accredited law schools. Over the past 10 years, UT has ranked eighth in the nation for placement of graduates as clerks on the U.S. Supreme Court.

South Texas College of Law combines superb faculty with outstanding skills training to provide a first-rate legal education in both theory and practice. South Texas' 91 national advocacy titles and its two Scribes Awards in the past four years bolster the law school's reputation for excellence in oral and written advocacy - a reputation recognized by *U.S. News & World Report*, which ranked South Texas 1st in advocacy and 20th in legal writing among all ABA-accredited law schools in 2005.

Texas Tech University School of Law develops the highest potential of all students and prepares them for a future that will depend increasingly on the ability to practice internationally and to operate at the cutting edge of legal technology. Texas Tech students are trained for the practice of law in accordance with the highest traditions of professional responsibility, whether as an advocate, counselor, judge, or law teacher.

The law school offers both full- and part-time studies leading to the J.D. degree, which includes lockstep courses, advanced required courses, core curriculum and general electives, and a 30-hour pro bono requirement. UHLC students are prepared for practice with a stellar research and writing program and practice courses focusing on trial and appellate advocacy, alternative dispute resolution, clinics, and transactional practice.
