Schedule

Tuition

Private attorneys and their staff must pay a fee of \$100/person for early registration. Non-profit attorneys and their staff receive a discounted fee of \$50/person for early registration. Attorneys who commit to taking a case with ProBAR will be allowed to attend the conference for free. Tuition includes the seminar manual.

Walk-In Registration

You may also register at the door on the day of the training seminar. Private attorneys and their staff will have to pay \$150/person for walk-in registration, and non-profit attorneys and their staff will have to pay \$100/person.
