



2011-2012 TYLA President-elect Candidates

The Texas Young Lawyers Association Board of Directors approved the nominations of **David Courreges** of Austin and **C.E. Rhodes** of Houston as 2011 president-elect candidates. This year, nominees for president-elect are from metropolitan cities. Biographies of the candidates, in alphabetical order, are included here. An interview with the two candidates will be included in the April issue. Votes for TYLA president-elect and district directors can be cast either via paper ballot or by voting online from April 1 to May 2. On April 1, attorneys eligible to vote will be mailed an election packet, including a paper ballot. Attorneys may either submit their paper ballot via mail or vote online using the information provided. The deadline to cast ballots is 5 p.m. CST on May 2.



David Courreges
Austin

David Courreges leads the governmental and legislative affairs division at De Leon and Washburn, P.C., where he practices in the areas of administrative law, association law, and mediation. He currently serves as vice president of the Texas Young Lawyers Association. A TYLA director since 2007, Courreges served as secretary in the 2009–10 bar year and as an executive committee advisor to the Community Education/Consumer Affairs, Law Focused Education, Online Member Services, and Technology committees, which helped create *Office in a Flash*, *Partnering for Pro Bono*, and materials for *Texas Lawyers for Texas Veterans*. Courreges served as co-chair of the Vote America/VoTexas committee that produced the award-winning *Vote America! Honor the Fight, Exercise Your Right* video. In 2008, he was the recipient of the TYLA President's Award. He received President's Awards of Merit in 2007 and 2009. Courreges received his B.A. from the University of Texas at Austin, his M.P.A. from St. Mary's University, and his J.D. from St. Mary's University School of Law.
